Bond counsel confirmed securing this designation is not necessary for bond validation since the WCCF is created under Chapter 163, F.S.

The St. Johns River Water Management District, South Florida Water Management District, and Southwest Florida Water Management District (Districts) published the draft 2025 Central Florida Water Initiative (CFWI) Regional Water Supply Plan (RWSP) in March 2025. T

he CFWI RWSP is intended to ensure the protection of water resources and identify sustainable water supplies for all water uses in the coordination area, which consists of Orange County, Osceola County, Polk County, Seminole County, and southern Lake County. The Water Cooperative of Central Florida (WCCF) submitted comments to the Districts on the draft 2025 CFWI RWSP timely by May 16, 2025. This informational item provides the Board an update on the comments submitted to the Districts by the WCCF.







 - Developed by SJRWMD, SFWMD and SWFWMD
 - Updated every 5 years
 - Orange County, Osceola County, Polk County, Seminole County, and southern Lake County
 - Plan to ensure the protection of water resources and identify sustainable water supplies for all water uses in the coordination area
- Draft 2025 CFWI RWSP: March 2025
- Water Cooperative of Central Florida (WCCF) submitted comments timely by 5/16/25



- Summary of key RWSP findings
 - Fresh groundwater availability of up to 760 MGD AADF (2020 CFWI RWSP) still valid
 - Local management strategies needed to address unacceptable impacts (e.g., MFLs recovery)
 - 2045 supply shortfall: 96 MGD AADF
 - Sufficient project options available to meet projected demands through 2045
 - Up to 497 MGD AADF (126 project options)
 - 45-52 MGD of potential conservation savings
 - Continued stakeholder engagement critical
 - Future demands can be met through 2045 while sustaining water resources

 - Minor updates to status of the Cypress Lake Wellfield (CLW) Project
 - Concentrate disposal Well #2 complete
 - Concentrate disposal Well #1 under construction
 - Clarify different classifications for Lower Floridan aquifer (LFA) projects
 - Support continued evaluation of each new LFA project for its effect on water resources
 - Request to be consistent in general descriptions of groundwater impacts
 - CLW project only specific project referenced in a general description of impacts in region
